Dear Friends

With the next copy of the Circuit Magazine due out any time now I will save you suffering two pastoral letters from your Minister - one will do, I am sure, so please do look in on the Circuit Magazine when it arrives.

Following careful consideration of the advice that is made available to us we have decided that Easter seems a good time to think of reopening church for attended services. This will start in Holy Week as follows:

Maundy Thursday, 7 pm, service of Holy Communion in church

Good Friday, 10-30 am, service of reflection in the hall

Easter Sunday, 10-30 am, all age celebration in church

11th April, 10-30 am, morning worship with Holy Communion

With the Prime Minister's suggested roadmap to recovery now available, we have also taken the decision to start phasing out the streaming of services on YouTube over a couple of months. So, though we will be having weekly services in church from Easter Sunday, we will only be streaming the 4th and 18th. However, the District will be offering pre-recorded services April 11th and 25th which we will put up on our YouTube channel. In May we will stream May 9th, as it is a Circuit Service for Easter Offerings, and possibly the service for Christian Aid week on the 16th. We are hoping that by the time of our Anniversary Weekend on the 23rd folk will feel able to be back in church. It should be noted that the District will continue to provide services on YouTube for the 4th Sunday of every month until August..

I am aware that this first step back to resuming activities in the church will, for some people, be difficult and challenging. After so many months of being so careful of who and how we meet, being back in 'company' can be really frightening! Yet it is so easy for those of us who are quite used to being 'around and about' to forget how difficult it is for others. One thing which prevented some from coming back into church over the summer and into the autumn was that others forgot to give them space. So please, do follow the distancing guidelines, which will likely change as time goes on, and be respectful of others 'space'.

At present, we have no idea when restrictions on social distancing, wearing face-masks and not singing in church will be lifted; that could still be several months away yet, but we wait to hear from the Government in due course.

Take care, look after one another and all blessings.
